Taking the Next Step to a Successful Future

Freshman Year

- An August Freshman Parent Meeting discusses start of the year expectations.
- Teachers watch for adjustment issues.
- Counselors meet with each freshman within the first six weeks of school.
- Counselors meet with freshmen quarterly.
- A January Freshman Parent Meeting reviews scheduling.
- Students begin their high school resume on NAVIANCE, an online counseling resource.

Sophomore Year

- Students take the PLAN test to determine current academic progress, explore career options, and determine action plans for the rest of their high school career.
- Students update their activities on NAVIANCE.
- Students take the PSAT test.
- Students and parents explore Career/College/Personality Profile Programs.
- A Sophomore Parent Meeting reviews test results of PLAN and PSAT test and scheduling procedure.
- Students meet quarterly with counselors.
- Sophomores take the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT).

Other side for Junior & Senior Activities

Junior Year

- Students take the PSAT in October.
- Juniors use NAVIANCE to do college searches, update their resume, and start college applications.
- Juniors participate in a Career Exploration survey first semester.
- A Junior Parent Night discusses the “College Count-Down” with families.
- Students meet with visiting college representatives.
- The college counselor sits down with each student during second semester.
- Counselors discuss with students options and needs for taking the SAT or ACT.
- Juniors sign up for ACT and/or SAT.
- Students take the SAT and/or ACT for college during the second semester of the junior year.
- Families participate in the Catholic High Schools College Night at Lourdes University.
- Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) Testing takes place in May.
- Students make campus visits.

Senior Year

- An August Senior Parent Meeting kicks off this fast-paced year.
- The College Counselor meets with students as needed as they go through the college application process.
- The college application process begins full-throttle in August.
- Families participate in the Catholic High Schools College Night at Lourdes University.
- Faculty work with seniors on their college essays.
- Students request recommendation letters from faculty and staff.
- Students meet with visiting college representatives.
- Seniors use the NAVIANCE college software program to navigate the college process.
- A college application workshop is held in early October.
- All college applications are due by mid-October.
- Seniors make college visits.
- Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) Testing takes place in May.
- A College Financial Aid Night for senior parents is held that includes information on how to complete the college FAFSA form.

End results -- young women graduate and start their next four successful years in the college that is the best fit for them.
