NDJA Tuition Assistance Non-Repayable Grants

How is Notre Dame Junior Academy affordable to my family?

Notre Dame Junior Academy (NDJA) works with families across a wide range of incomes. Often, middle class families find with some help from the school that an exceptional education is within reach for their daughter.

In 2011-12, **over 70% of all NDA and NDJA families received an assistance award.** Families who received tuition assistance ranged in income from less than \$20,000 to over \$95,000 based on family circumstances (medical expenses, multiple students in college/private school tuitions, job loss, etc.).

How is tuition assistance determined?

Families complete the FACTS Management Co. (FMC) assessment. Based on the FMC assessment, the NDJA Tuition Assistance Committee determines the award.

Over \$1.7 million in tuition awards was given in 2011-12. Most were non-repayable grants. The grants represent the school's commitment to continue the tradition of the Sisters of Notre Dame and are based strictly on financial need.

How to apply

All tuition assistance is calculated on demonstrated need and is strictly CONFIDENTIAL. To be considered, a family **must complete** a needs assessment through FMC.

- 1) Complete the FMC assessment form online.**
Go to applyFMC.nda.org for a link or connect on our Web site at www.nda.org. Click Junior Academy Admissions, select Apply FMC.
- 2) Pay the \$25 FMC processing fee online or mail a check with your tax forms.**
- 3) Mail a copy of your 2010 Tax Return and 2011 W-2 Wage and Tax Statements to FMC after you complete the process online.**
- 4) FMC will send an analysis to the NDA Tuition Assistance Committee who will determine the award.**
- 5) January 16, 2012 is the preferred deadline date for accepted Junior Academy families to receive financial award information in March. After March, processing time is three to four weeks, once all material is in and students has been accepted into the Junior Academy.**

All tuition assistance applicants must file the FACTS Management Co. (FMC) Assessment.

What is FMC?

FACTS Management Co. (FMC) is an independent, national family assessment firm used by most northwest Ohio private schools to assist in determining financial need along with other services such as managing tuition payments.

FMC charges a \$25 processing fee to complete the application online. It takes about 15 minutes and requires a mailed copy of your tax returns for 2010 and 2011 W-2 Wage and Tax Statements for both you and your spouse. *In the case of divorced families NDA needs to have information from both financially responsible parents, so both families must complete the FMC assessment.*

For households with alternative wage information i.e. Social Security Income, Welfare, Child Support, Food Stamps, Workers' Compensation, and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) — you'll need to submit copies to FMC.

FMC DOES NOT AWARD GRANTS — THEY ONLY PROVIDE AN ANALYSIS FOR THE NDJA TUITION ASSISTANCE COMMITTEE.

Save time, Apply Online

Applying online is the fastest and most direct method of submitting your FMC assessment. It allows FMC to review your application faster once they receive tax returns and W-2 Wage and Tax Statements.
